After feedback from various professionals in the BIPP field, CJAD-funded program coordinators and facilitators, attendees from Dedication and the BIPP Annual Conference, TCFV chose to re-organize and expand BIPP training workshops to meet all levels of continuing education for BIPP professionals.

The new educational series will be comprised of two parts. Part one will focus on foundational information that include beginner-intermediate level topics. Part two will focus on intermediate-advanced level topics. Each part will be made up of 2-days of classroom time and 8-hours of self-paced online modules.
